I am writing to you from the Bishops' Conference of Scotland. I am Bishop Brian McGee, Bishop of Argyll and the Isles and I have recently been appointed by the Scottish Bishops to succeed Archbishop Emeritus Mario Conti as the Bishop responsible for interreligious dialogue in Scotland.

It is indeed one of the many lights that have shone in these dark times.

As you celebrate Pope Francis' latest encyclical, Fratelli Tutti I send my greetings and those of the Bishops' of Scotland to wish you a happy feast which has to be celebrated this year in such limited circumstances.
